


Discussion

An improper fraction is a fraction where the numerator is greater than the denominator. This means the fraction represents a value greater than one whole. For example, $\frac{5}{4}$ means five parts when the whole is divided into four equal parts.

Examples (Answers shown for learning)

		$\frac{5}{4}$ represents 1 whole and $\frac{1}{4}$ more
		$\frac{6}{4}$ represents 1 whole and $\frac{2}{4}$ more
		$\frac{7}{4}$ represents 1 whole and $\frac{3}{4}$ more
